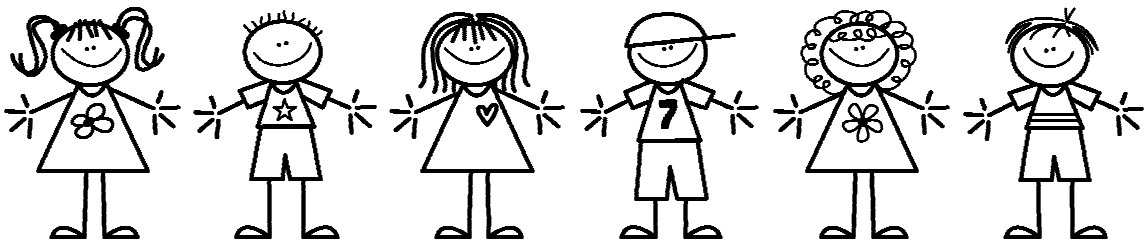
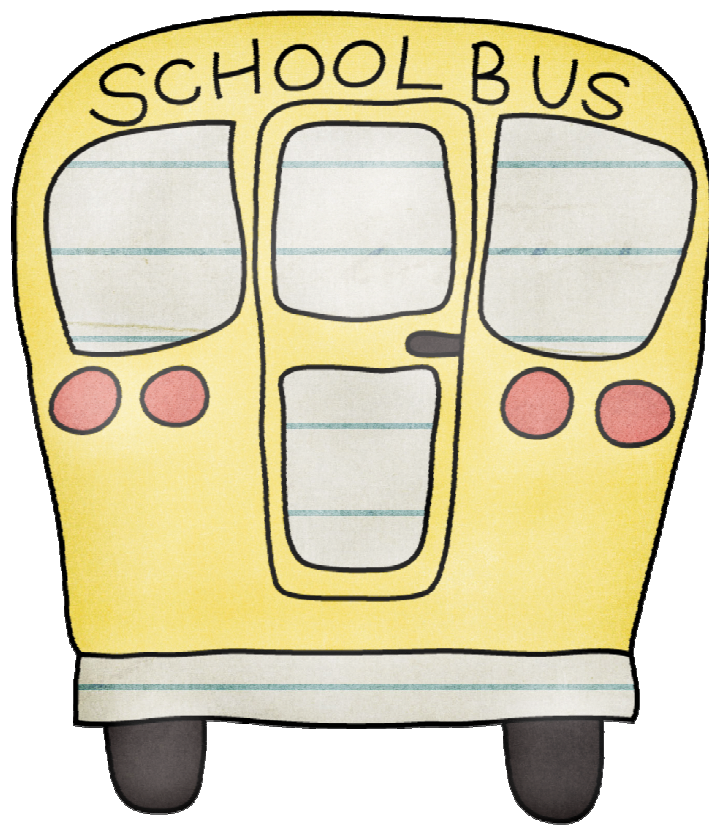


Sight words in Seconds!



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An easy, fast and effective program to teach your students the dolch sight words in seconds a day!

Teaching sight words is an important job of the primary teacher. The dolch words are a scientifically designed list of the most common words found in primary stories. Many of these words cannot be sounded out correctly, and do need to be memorized (for example, the word "the"). Students need to have instant recognition of the sight words in order to read and write more fluently.

This program will help teach your students the sight words in a way that is fun and involves their parents. I find the parents are generally very supportive of the program, and appreciate being involved. The extra reinforcement the students receive from having their parents help with the program also increases the chances that your students will retain these words.

Included in this booklet you will find:

- an explanation of how the program works
- a letter to send home outlining the program to the parents
- a form letter to send home with the sight words for the week
- a note for the child to bring home listing the words they were unable to read
- record sheets
- all the dolch word masters ready to be photocopied and cut out for the program

The dolch words are grouped into the following categories: pre-primer, primer, grade one, grade two and grade three. In grade one I start the program with the pre-primer words in September. However, an older grade may choose to start at a higher level.

The first step is to choose the level of dolch words for your students to start the program. Select the appropriate master
