#### **Consonant Blends**


A consonant blend is made up of two or more consonants together. Although they mix, or blend with one another, you can still hear the sound of each letter. Consonant blends can come at the beginning of a word, in the middle, or at the end of the word.

#### **R** Blends

R-blends are consonants that blend with r. An example of an r-blend is the <u>tr</u> in <u>tree</u>.




