


So he won't be alone.

















Helpers

He's very long and very wide.


He has a very wrinkled hide.



You can't make a turtle come out.



He cannot fly. He cannot hop. He cannot run at all. But you should see The way he goes Slowly up the wall.








The Bee Hive


Here is the bee hive

Four and five.








Jellyfish

Little Charlie Chipmunk


Little Charlie Chipmunk was a talker, mercy me!
He chattered after breakfast and he chattered after tea.


